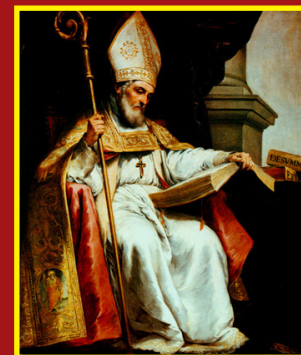

Order of St. Isidore of Seville

Welcome! The **Order of St. Isidore of Seville** was established on January 1, 2000, in celebration of the beginning of Christ's Third Millennium and in honor of St. Isidore of Seville, the Patron Saint of the Internet.

The main purpose of the Order is to promote the ideals of Christian chivalry through the medium of the Internet. The Order of St. Isidore of Seville makes no claims of antiquity, but it aims to instill in its members a **Chivalric Code** so as to be conscious



of their duties as Christians and as Knights or Dames of the Order, and so use the Internet in an appropriate manner.

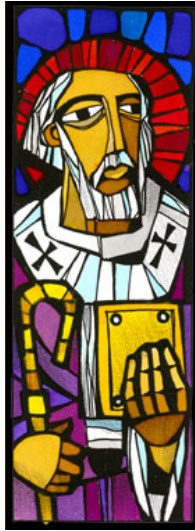
Membership

Full membership of the Order is open to all men and women:

- over the age of 20**;
- of good character who will follow the rules of chivalry;
- who accept and acknowledge the Christian beliefs as contained in the Nicene Creed;
- who accept the 27 books of the New Testament;
- who respect the right of other Christian Churches to worship according to their own doctrines.

** Applicants 18 through 20 years of age may apply to be Squires or Ladies-in-Waiting. On their 21st birthday, these members would become full members of the order, with the rank of Knight or Dame.

Prospective members of the Order may use the online application form found at the Order's website. In the event of problems submitting an online application, prospective members may contact the Admissions Officer.



All members are expected to be active in and on behalf of the Order. The YaBB forum is the Order's official business forum though some items may also be posted at our Yahoo Group. Membership at both sites will be reviewed periodically. Profiles seen to be inactive will be deleted. This does not mean members are removed from the Order. All OStI members are strongly encouraged to join and participate at the official discussion board. Your input is welcomed and needed.

Members of the Order are divided into Lay and Ecclesiastical members. Any Lay member who subsequently becomes ordained will then become an Ecclesiastical member. Applicants for Ecclesiastical membership must provide details of their ordination.

Oblations and Finances

The Order does not actively canvass any funds or gifts from its members. However, if members wish to make a dona-

tion towards the Order's expenses, they may do so. If there is a question regarding donations, please contact the Order's Chief Justiciar & Commissioner.

Knights and Dames of the Order are expected to support their own churches and charitable causes. The Order has provided some modest financial support to the Holy Land Project and the Aboud Village School.

Governance of the Order

The Order of St. Isidore of Seville is governed by the Grand Magistry, comprised of various officers, including the Governor-General, the Chancellor, the Chaplain-General, and the Chief Justiciar & Commissioner.

Priories have been established in the United States and the United Kingdom and Commanderies have been founded in the United States, the United Kingdom, Europe, and Canada.
